

The Shirley K. Sullivan Education Fund Grant terms/conditions:

1. Allows all active cooperative communicators and the CCA regions to apply for grants.
2. Educational programs eligible for funding include, but are not limited to, regional CCA workshops, national cooperative education programs (NICE, GICL, etc.) and other opportunities which advance skill and knowledge in the field of cooperative communication.
3. Grant size/number of grants offered will be based on need, merit, and amount of funding available.
4. Individuals who are awarded grants become ineligible for future funding.
5. Upon completion of the education program, awardees must submit a brief report on the value of their educational experience, along with appropriate expense receipts for grant funding to be released.

Applications are accepted throughout the year.

About Shirley K. Sullivan

Strengthening the future of cooperative communications was Shirley Sullivan's mission and her passion.

Throughout her career Sullivan devoted tremendous energy to not only improving her own skills as a co-op communicator, but also finding ways to help others – especially newcomers to the business – build theirs as an avid supporter of cooperative communication education programs.

Sullivan began her cooperative communications career as a senior editor with CF Industries, an interregional plant food manufacturing cooperative, and joined CCA in 1967. She later served 10 years as an editor with Southern States Cooperative. She served several years on the CCA Board of Directors and in 1994 was named the winner of its prestigious H.E. Klinefelter Award recognizing career achievement.

A native of Louisiana, Sullivan graduated with a journalism degree from Wesleyan College, Macon, Georgia. She spent several years as a weekly newspaper editor in North Dakota and as a free-lance writer for major newspapers across the country.

Sullivan died in June 1997 following a brief illness. In 1998, CCA established the Sullivan Educational Fund, housed within the Cooperative Development Foundation, to provide grants to communicators seeking to enhance their skills.
